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
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
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## A Letter From our Founder



# **Did You Know?**

A few years ago, Wayne Joseph, Superintendent for Chino Valley Unified School District, created an organization called HOPE (Helping Other People Everyday). It was Mr. Joseph's dream and passion to have a district facility where students and family members could come and receive assistance with minor needs.

Mr. Joseph formulated a plan and invited businesses, churches and non-profit organizations to work together to provide supplies for basic hygiene needs, clothing, shoes etc. that could be used by various recipients.

As RTCE volunteers, we saw this as an excellent opportunity to get our students and their families involved in helping others. So, last year, we worked with the HOPE Center to ascertain their needs. Once we had that information, we gave the list to the students, and in turn, they took it home and worked with their parents to provide

the needed items. In 2017 hundreds of items were turned in by our kids to help fill the HOPE Center shelves. This project was so well received by RTCE students we plan on doing it again this year.

We are exceedingly blessed to participate in this very worthwhile cause knowing that many of our students are in foster care, homeless or their families have incomes below the poverty level.

# Here I Am Lord, Send Me by Lisa Enda



I first felt a tug for the Released Time ministry several years ago when seeing Gail give an annual update and appeal to the congregation at church. RTCE struck a cord with me. A couple years earlier my husband and I pulled our children from the public school to homeschool them so that I could infuse as much Jesus into their foundation as possible. And here was RTCE presenting the opportunity to witness to kids in those same schools we had left! As the time for me to get involved was not right due to family commitments, RTCE was filed away in my mind for future. Fast forward to 2017 when all my kids had transitioned back to the school system - and here's Gail at church again! I had excuses floating through my mind, but I remembered that call on my spirit and it had been so

clear that this is where I was to serve. I shoved away my fear and feelings of inadequacy and told Jesus, "Here I am, send me!" and marched up to the RTCE table immediately after service and signed up. And they took me!

I have come in with no formal teaching experience, but instead with a lot of self doubt! I didn't want to just "teach", but to truly reach the hearts of these kids for the Kingdom. I knew that I alone was not capable of this; but rather I must surrender and let the Holy Spirit do His work! I remind myself that God chooses the weak and the least to do great things. This was going to be exciting! So much so, that I was asked to teach not only at one school, but two! I was given a school with a maxed-out bus of 25 students, and the other school

with only two, wondering if we'd even be able to hold a class at all (it has now grown to 6.) Working alongside my drivers/assistants, we have exhilarating classes watching the Lord show up. We get to witness the childrens' eyes and faces watching intently, their voices singing worship, the laughter, and the eagerness to ask questions they (and their parents!) have been wondering about. I will never forget the first class when we stepped into the school office to collect the kids: we were immediately greeted by 20+ pairs of eyes belonging to fidgety but quiet, expectant children who were there to be taught the Bible - at public school no less! Awesome! To be a part of this is incredibly special and an honor! God spoils me!
